

The Alexandria Gun Club met on 5/19/18 at the outdoor range for a membership meeting and range clean up.

President Brian Armstrong called the meeting to order.

OLD BUSINESS

Membership present discussed the handicapped porta potty cost. Because figures were not available during the January meeting, we had capped our vote at a cost of approximately \$2000 for this item. We learned that the porta potty would cost closer to \$3500. A motion was made by Tim B to amend the cost to purchase the porta potty to \$3500 and 2nd by Dave. Membership voted and approved. **Update, the porta potty was delivered this past weekend. We will be getting a lock for the toilet paper. In the meantime, please make sure it isn't set on the floor or thrown in the toilet. Total cost of this item was \$3221.25.

Mike Townsend was able to bring bidding for shooting stalls in the pistol range building. Byron and Tim made motions and seconded them for a cost of \$1600 for 3 stalls. Membership voted and approved. Mike will pursue the purchase of these items.

Signage for the range – the board will work on this. Please notify a board member if you have specific requests/ideas.

The storage shed has been delivered to the range and many items moved into it to clean up the membership building. President Brian Armstrong has the key for the current lock until a new lock can be purchased. If you have questions regarding the contents of the shed or obtaining access, please contact Brian.

NEW BUSINESS

2x6 boards were placed along the bottom of the rifle sheds to prevent tables from being pulled out of the building.

We will also be putting some sort of fencing along the top of the range shed to prevent shooters from shooting too high. The current boards were to prevent shooters from shooting above the target areas for the safety of land owners beyond the range. Please refrain from using any of those boards as a “rest”.

The pistol shed was made safer by adding fencing along both sides of the building. Please make sure that you are accessing that range from any direction other than through the doors of the building.

We have been receiving many calls/emails from instructors who will be utilizing the ranges for classes. Please be respectful of those groups and communicate with each other if you have questions/concerns while at the range.
